Art was born on December 20, 1929, in Detroit, Michigan to Joseph and Jean (Cruickshank) Winter. Art was a very proud man that accomplished a lot in his life. He grew up in the Detroit area, graduated from Jonesville High School and attended Henry Ford Trade School. He and his wife purchased and ran the Liberty General Store. Later he restored the grist mill turbine into a hydroelectric plant. It was quite the undertaking. Art retired again after 27 years. He dearly loved his family and purchased land in Canada, where they built a cottage on the lake and spent 63 years, as a summer escape. The family enjoyed fishing, hiking, and exploring the vast wilderness. He was also a proud member of the Hanover-Horton Area Lions Club, where he ran the Lions Club Christmas cheese sales, the spring vedalia onion sale and helped with the 4th of July annual chicken barbeque. Art also was a strong supporter of the local Red Cross blood drives. He will be missed by all who knew and loved him.

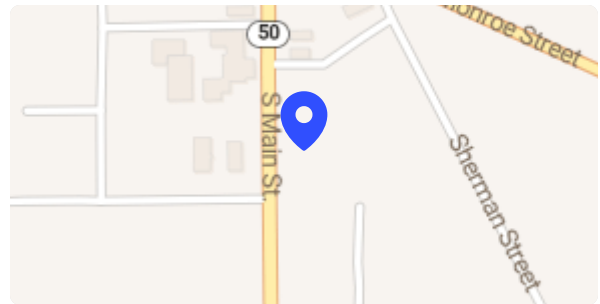
