Leonard A Farrell, 92, passed away October 4, 2021. Leonard's family and friends will gather on Monday, October 11, 2021 from 10:00 a.m. – 11:00 a.m. at Brooklyn Presbyterian Church, 160 N. He had a great interest in history, especially the Civil War. Later in life, he loved going on cruises with his wife and friends.
